"Every human being has business with God." This statement by John Calvin underscores the importance of a true conversion experience. I am leading an in-depth verse by verse study in the Gospel of Mark on Wednesday nights starting at 6:45. In our last meeting I taught from the Parable of the Sower (I think a better title would be the Parable of the Soils). Parables were Jesus' favorite means of showing His listeners who was in the kingdom of God and who was on the outside of it. In order to understand the parables one needs the Spirit. To be in the Spirit is to be in the kingdom. Notice how the parable begins and ends in Mark 4:3, and 4:9: "Listen!" If you can hear the meaning of the parable, you have ears to hear. This particular parable likens soil to the condition of one's heart. There are three bad soils and one good soil. To me, this is an excellent passage for explaining and presenting the Gospel. The parable urges us to do what Calvin said earlier, to do "business with God." When the Spirit shows you the soil that best represent your heart, He requires that you respond to God and do business with him. Godly sorrow produces repentance and repentance leads to joy and a true conversion experience. I think churches in our culture are teeming with almost Christians. The prosperity preacher says sorrow is not good, the Bible says it is a requirement for true conversion. Sinclair Ferguson put it best when he said, "In developing Christian experience we cannot separate the rhythm of sorrow and joy. If we think that Christian living is all joy and happiness, we are heading for a rude awakening." Take my advice, when you hear the Spirit speak and His Word brings sorrow or conviction, do business with God immediately! Which soil best epitomizes your heart? Listen! Welcome to the kingdom!

Dear FBCA Family,

We just began our Wall-O-Money Fundraiser in January. Each year we have successfully raised over \$3,000 for our youth through this fundraiser, which is amazing and worthy of recognition. However, we have yet to empty the wall entirely. This year the youth department has chosen to limit our fundraisers in order to allow others to raise funds as well without overburdening the church. Trust me, this is going to be more painful for them than it is for you. But feel free to give them all a hard time all the same.

On Friday, February 28th, we will be taking the youth on an outing to go to a Christian concert called "Winter Jam." Winter Jam consists of 10 Christian bands/artists and 4 hours of worship for just \$15/person. Winter Jam is a fun experience that will be remembered by our youth for years later.
